September Meeting Report

THE VIDEO - PETER'S MESSAGE

"I just want to tell the fellas there is nothing to worry about" This is what Peter wanted to say to our Support Group and indeed had planned to do so at the February meeting but sadly that was not to be.

When Peter entered palliative care at Neringah Hospital in Wahroonga around the end of September 2016 he was very ill and his cancer was a riot. However after a couple of weeks of expert care and titration of his medications, he rallied and was able to spend a further precious 2 months at home. When he was asked to participate in the video there was no script or rehearsal and he saw it as a way of giving back, he was in awe of the facility and its staff and wanted to say thank you.

"Palliative care" is about "relieving pain without dealing with the cause of the condition". Peter advised in the video that the staff were able to relieve him of fear and worry as well as pain, and this meant that he was in a good head space which was great for himself and also helped Meredith, his wife.

Being able to talk about his future knowing he would be comfortable and free of pain and fear allowed him to talk about his wishes for his funeral with his family, which empowered them in being able to carry out his wishes. Peter was able to discuss with Meredith how she might live

her life without him, only because the fear and pain had been lifted.

Before and after the video Meredith was able to speak to us, her courage was amazing and we all appreciated this. She was able to tell us that Hammond Care is a Christian Charity but do not question any patient's religious beliefs. A companion bed was set up in Peter's room for Meredith for his last two weeks.

Often good healthcare conjures up financial constraints and this can govern our health choices. HammondCare accepts everyone requiring help, whether from a wealthy background or those with few resources. HammondCare do receive government funding and will claim direct from Medicare in your name. Biomarker discovery to guide treatment for men with castration resistant prostate cancer.

A biomarker is a biological molecule that can tell us what's going on inside the body. They are particularly useful for treating cancer. Biomarkers can be used to detect cancer early, determine what kind of tumour is present, what is the best treatment, and if the treatment has worked. Finding a good biomarker to guide the best treatment of castration resistant prostate cancer has been very difficult. Two recent studies have made important progress in the search for biomarkers for men with this stage of prostate cancer.

Biomarkers can be various biological molecules, such as proteins or genes. Biomarker tests can also be images, such as PSMA-PET scans. PSA is a biomarker for prostate cancer, but it's not perfect. PSA in the blood indicates the presence of prostate cancer, as well as how much disease is present. A high PSA level is associated with more extensive prostate cancer and poorer prognosis. There are other biomarker tests that can be useful upon diagnosis with prostate cancer such as the **Oncotype DX** gene test. However, we need more and better biomarkers, particularly to guide patients to the most beneficial treatments.

Biomarker discovery is a large part of the prostate cancer research field. **Developing a good test for a biomarker is not too difficult. The difficulty is in finding the right biomarker to test for.**
